After 10 months of operations, sales are well ahead of 2017. We continue to see the majority of our growth in our Petroleum and Ag departments.

In 2017, the Board authorized a patronage allocation of 4% of members' purchases and during our Equity Days in July, we paid out over 3.5 million in cash to our member-owners.

The Brandon Food Store opened for business in the spring of 2003. This past year, after 14 years of operation, a significant renovation was completed. On August 17 we had our Grand Re-Opening celebration, which included a ribbon cutting ceremony, speeches, live entertainment, bouncy castles, face painting, and free Cooper dolls for all the kids. We also hosted a free barbeque with Special Olympics Westman – we provided them with a donation and encouraged others to donate if they could. Throughout the store, we had many more free samples and giveaways, which included major daily prize draws for two weeks following the event. We are extremely happy with the renovation - it is a whole new look for the interior of the store and has been well received by our Brandon Customers.

On October 29 and 30, Heritage Co-op and Strathclair Co-op held special membership meetings to hear information and vote on a proposed amalgamation between the two Co-ops. Both votes resulted in overwhelming support of an amalgamation. The amalgamation will officially take effect on December 30. This will see 3 retail locations added to Heritage Co-op, and bring our total outlets to 6 cardlocks, 6 Gas Bar\Convenience Stores, 2 Touchless Car Washes, 2 Wand Washes, 4 Food Stores, 1 Pharmacy, 3 Home Centres, 3 Agro Centres, and a fleet of bulk petroleum trucks. We feel that the amalgamation will be positive for Heritage Co-op and allow us to continue to grow and remain competitive in an ever-changing retail landscape.

Our Annual General Meeting will be set for early April 2018. The Governance of our Co-operative revolves around a Board of Directors elected from the members of Heritage Co-op. Each year three Director positions are up for election. Under our by-laws, nominations for the position of Director must be delivered to the nominating committee 14 days prior to the Annual Meeting.
